ENTRANCES AND PARKING:

Please drop the athletes off at the main entrance. School vehicles must park at the far end of the parking lot. Spectators may use parking lot and use the main entrance.

OTHER GENERAL INFORMATION:

- Good sportsmanship, respect, and proper behavior are expected from the athletes, coaches, and spectators. Situations needing to be addressed will be handled in accordance with the OHSAA and NFHS rules.
- General concessions will be available.
- Athletes may use the locker rooms, but may not use the lockers. Athletes are encouraged to keep their belongings with them and to leave valuables at home.
- Teams may display team banners and tasteful signs that can be hung with rope or string. Tape or other adhesives may not be used.
- Each team will be assigned a camp area after entries are received. Teams are responsible for the cleanup of that area upon completion of the meet.

SCORING:

The conference meet will be scored as a timed final.

Scoring will be done as follows, 1st through 16th places, respectively:

Individual Events: 20, 17, 16, 15, 14, 13, 12, 11, 9, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1

Relay Events: 40, 34, 32, 30, 28, 26, 24, 22, 18, 14, 12, 10, 8, 6, 4, 2

Entries:

Each team will be permitted to submit a maximum of four (4) entries into each individual event and two (2) entry into each relay event. Each competitor will be permitted to enter a maximum of four (4) events of which no more than two (2) are individual events. Diving will count as one (1) of the two (2) individual events. Only one relay can score.

Coaches may list up to eight (8) individuals per relay team on the relay cards. Any four (4) of those individuals listed may swim. Relay cards for all relay events must be submitted at the close of the coaches meeting. Coaches may include those team members who are listed as the alternates for the team on the relay cards.

WEATHER CONTINGENCY PLAN:

The GWOC Commissioner will make the decision for the postponement of any or all meets. Per the bylaws the meet is subject to cancellation pending the availability of facilities, staffing, and contracted timing and scoring. If any of the meets are rescheduled a contingency plan will be communicated to the Athletic Director of each school.

Swimming entries must be submitted to the entry chairperson via email using HyTek. Entries must be received by the entry deadline. Head coaches will receive proof of entry via email for review and need to advise of any corrections no later than **12:00 Noon on Tuesday**. The psych sheet will be posted on www.swimmeet.com on **Wednesday**.

Please include the following information with your entries:

- School name
- Name, phone number, and email address of head coach
- All athletes, both swimmers and divers
- Athlete class (freshman, sophomore, junior, senior)

Team Check In:

Teams must present as a group using the athlete entrance.

Teams will not be admitted to the facility more than 20 minutes before the posted warm up start times, and it is advised that the athletes remain in their school vehicle until that time.

To be admitted to the facility and to receive a team packet, at least one coach must be present.

Team Area:

Athletes must occupy their assigned camp area outside of the pool for the conference meet. Swimmers are not permitted in any spectator seating area at any time.

Warm Up Sessions:

Warm up sessions will be conducted prior to the meet. Lane assignments will be made and communicated to the swim coaches once entries have been received for the meet. Warm up monitors will be present to insure the safe behavior of the swimmers. Swimmers are to use feet first entry into the pool. All lanes will be used for starts during the last 15 minutes of the warm up sessions. The dive well area will be available for warm up/warm down during the meet.

Coaches Meetings:

A coach's meeting will be conducted at the posted times. The Commissioner and meet referee will review key information relevant to the meet. Relay cards must be submitted to the referee by the close of the coach's meeting. The meet referee and scoring personnel will be available to accept declared false starts and/or scratches for athletes.

- A scratch or no show is the withdrawal of a competitor from the remainder of his or her events in the meet.
- A declared false start is the withdrawal of a competitor from a specific event (including diving).
- A swimmer or diver must declare a false start prior to the event or heat in order to avoid penalty or disqualification in subsequent events.
- A coach may declare a false start on behalf of any of his or her athletes. A swimmer or diver with a "no show" in an event (no declared false start) will not be permitted to compete in subsequent events.
- Coaches will be permitted to replace athletes who have been scratched with competitors who were listed with the entries and who have not been entered in the maximum number of events.
- Coaches will not be permitted to move participants from individual events for which they are already entered.
